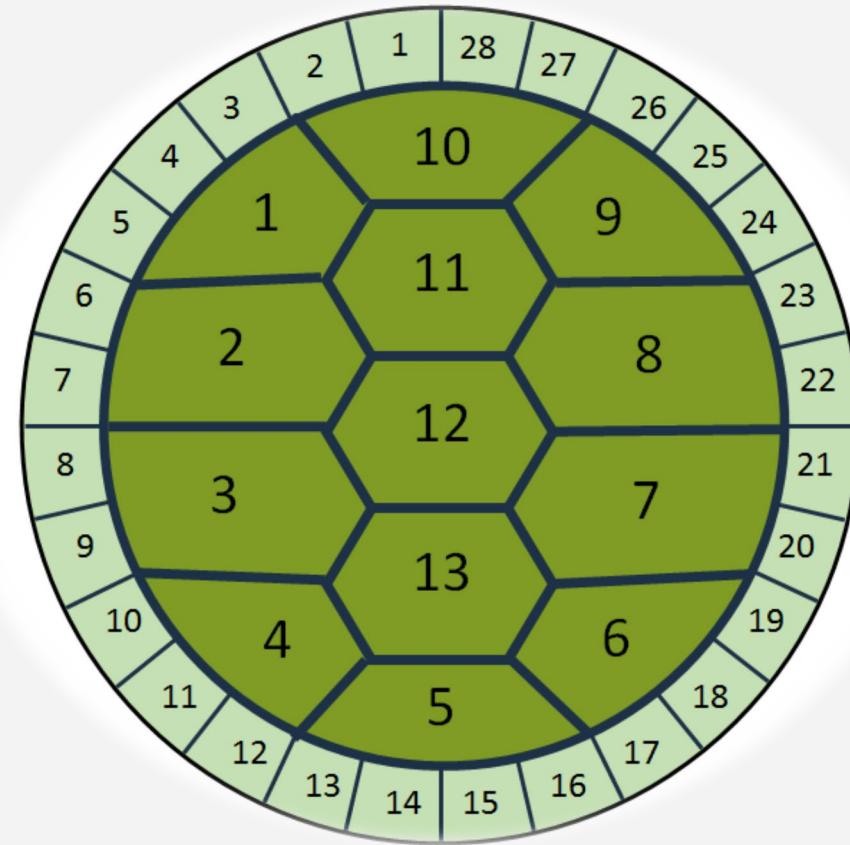

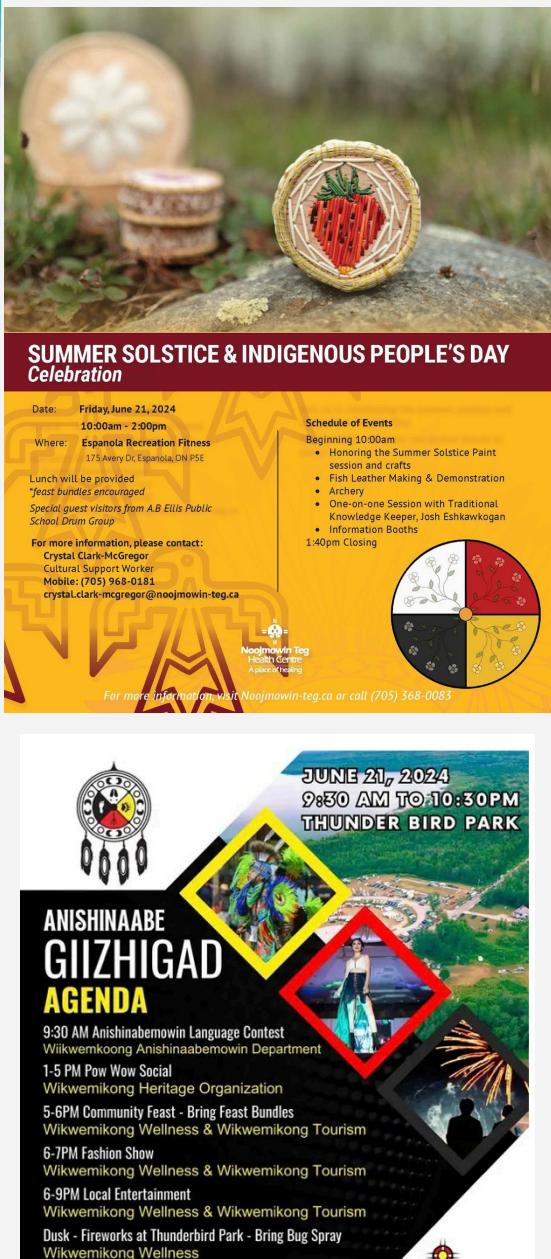
The national day celebrates and honours Anishinaabe people, community, history, traditions, and instills pride.
